Most of the members of this chorus have at some point in their lives found it necessary to deal with an unruly child by yelling at them. It isn't the most pleasant thing we've ever done. However, should the need arise it is the responsibility of the person directing/teaching/coaching/speaking in front of the chorus to recognize the problem and to stop whatever they are doing for us until we give them our full attention. We will not appoint a "master at arms" to help to enforce what should be common courtesy. But, as your elected President I will, when I feel it is required, step forward and assist the person in front by quieting the chorus. The only other individual who may appropriately provide this assistance is the Program Vice-President. It is no one else's job!

Lastly, our meetings begin at 7:00 not 7:15 or 7:30. At 7:00 we are expected to join together on the risers to begin warming-up our voices and minds in preparation for our rehearsal. Our chapter is also a social

Although we prefer that everyone join in the warm-ups since this will help us individually and as a chorus, we understand that visiting is also a part of our meetings. Since we have the use of more than one room in our meeting facility and since the chorus MUST use the large room for rehearsal, all other members who choose to not join us on the risers are expected to take their conversation, no matter how quiet, to another room where it will not interfere with the chorus activities.


# IT'S **NEVER** TOO SOON!
