

If she ever slows down, I'm gonna' find out her name. I might even marry her!





This is a program that our district supports to help both choruses and quartets in improving their public performances. Several members of the Music Team met with Gary after our show to hear his evaluation. Gary rated us as excellent in areas such as Musicality, Presentation, Discipline and overall Entertainment Value. He also gave us a couple of areas we can improve on, like maintaining the same high energy at the end of the show as we had in the first half. In Gary's words, "All in all, a WONDERFUL show—one in which everyone on the risers, and out in front, needs to feel a great deal of pride.

Ahead for HOA: In the next few weeks we have two major performances scheduled—Richmond, MO. on Sunday, March 30 and John Knox on Tuesday, April 8. More details for each of these are or will be on the HOA website (thanks, Vince).

Bill Biffle is scheduled to return to Kansas City on Thursday, April 24. Here's a chance to take our singing up another notch.

The first 2 recording sessions for the chorus CD project are set for Saturday, May 31 (no, that's not Memorial Day weekend) and Saturday, June 21. Both of these sessions are scheduled to be all-day sessions running from 9am-6pm with an hour for lunch. I'll be providing more details as we get closer to the recording dates, but for now, please block out those two dates on your calendar. This is going to be a very exciting project for the *Heart of America Chorus* and when we're finished we should have a product that we can all be proud of.





Ten Years Ago-April, 1993

The April 1993 edition of *Harmonotes* began with an air of disappointment with the overall planning of our March 13 annual show (although everybody seemed satisfied with the

chorus performance), our editorial comment listed eight injunctions to the 1994 planners which involved mainly an earlier (like NOW) in the planning process to include greater participation by the chapter board in the major decision making. (Our editor threw in his two favorite plugs for the use of a chorus shell for every performance and the singing of "Keep the Whole World Singing," "somewhere, somehow" in the show program.)

Director **Jim Bagby** was critical of the choice of a headline quartet and the chorus

song that opened the second half (I don't remember why in either case). On the plus side, Jim announced that the chorus "sang well in the afternoon and great at night." Said Jim, "I'm still running -into people who rave about "I'll Walk With God." And Jim certainly must have been pleased with the 85 singers on the risers.

The *Heartbeats* were raffling a quilt as a fund-raiser for the trip to the International contest in Calgary. The tickets were a dollar apiece, six for \$5.00. **Jan Mathieu** was collecting for the tickets. A total of \$760 had already been accumulated. In addition, there was a full-page announcement that the *Heartbeats* were planning multiple garage sales during the spring to raise funds for the Calgary excursion. The first was scheduled for Saturday, April 24, and the announcement included an urgent plea for donations of items to be sold. The planning committee included **Joann Bagby, Betty Einess, Peggy Pennington, Bernie Thompson, Linda Schumacher** and **Jane Rutherford.** (As I recall they raised something like \$1,200!)

Bill Wall included a eulogy for HOA veteran (from 1944 to 1993) **Ed Eichman**, who had passed away recently. Bill tells how he and Ed formed a quartet called the *Missouri Pewkes* that included **Don Thorne**, **Joe Costigan** and later, **Barney Wasson**.

Thirty Years Ago - April, 1973

Remember "Auditions for Admissions?" It was a recruiting gimmick out of the International head-quarters that was designed to appeal to the better singers who might be challenged by the fact that we required prospective members to audition for membership. Administrative Vice president (later to be called the Membership Vice President) Ron Abel announced that HOA's first "AFA" would be held on May 1. There was an effort to saturate the area with publicity (including an announcement by Dan Henry during the annual show on March 17) to attract as many good singers as possible. I'm sure Ron can tell you how successful it was.

Chapter officers were **Al Moritz** (president), **Ron Abel** (AVP), **Jim Bagby** (Program Vice president), **Alan Durick** (secretary), and **John Vaughn** (treasurer). And guess who the chorus director was? Give up? It was Ol' **Dan [Henry]** himself. **Steve Leone** was the assistant director. The chapter was meeting at 8 p.m. on Tuesday evenings at the Unity Temple.

Fifty Years Ago - April, 1953

In the light of the difficulty we've had in the past in getting a write-up in the local paper, it's interesting to note that the April, 1953 issue of *Harmonotes* includes reproductions of four clippings from the Kansas City Star.

One tells of a new recording on the Damon label that featured **Don McPherson** singing all six (six?) parts of a song called "Where The Mountains Meet The Sky."

Then there's another item referring to a program called "SPEBSQSA Varieties," on Thursday night, on Station WHBY. **Johnny Miller** was to be the MC.

Next was a report on a benefit program that raised \$2,800 for the Blue Ridge Methodist Church. The edifice had been destroyed by fire a year earlier.

Lastly, there was a review of the annual chapter show on April 18-19, which highlighted the appearance of the headline quartet, the *Four Hearsemen* of Amarillo, Texas.

The article makes a big point of the fact that each quartet member had a degree in music. Wonder how many contemporary foursomes can make that statement?
