Kudos go to **Stacy Schumacher** and **Carter Combs** for directing the mass choruses and achieving a great sound and performance. To Surefire! for entertaining the students and judging the boy's preliminary quartet contest. An awesome job, guys! To the HOA and KC Sweet Ad members that showed up and helped run the day goes a great big THANK YOU!

In the junior division, Pioneer Trail Junior High (Olathe) won both the girls and boys championships; **Jan Holtus** is the vocal music teacher. In fact, the junior boys champs outscored all of the senior boys quartets.

In the senior division, Rose Hill HS (from the Wichita area) won the senior girls championship and the senior boy champions are from Shawnee Mission West HS.

Rose Hill and Shawnee Mission West were both first-time participants in the program. **Charley Forsyth**, who brought us the great senior boys guartets from Andover, is now teaching at Rose Hill and he has returned with an outstanding senior girls quartet. Shawnee Mission West brought the boys and two girls quartets. All three made it to the finals. What a way to make a debut.

All four of the champion guartets appeared on the annual show and did a great job.

The Kansas City Chapter's Award of Harmony was presented to Forsyth. For years he has made barbershop music a part of his school curriculum. While at Andover, KS he brought several boys guartets to the Harmony Explosion and had many medal winners,

including two champions. This year was his first time with a guartet from Rose Hill and they won the Senior Girls Championship.

The Award of Harmony is the Society award that honors nonbarbershoppers who promote the barbershop style of music. Charley is the fourth educator who has received this award from the Kansas City Chapter.

The ninth annual Harmony Explosion will be held at Shawnee Mission West High School in 2005. The date will be announced later. 🔨

Ten Years

Dale Neuman announced that our 1994 annual show on March 19 "broke records for attendance (over 2.000 for the matinee and over 1,900 for the evening show), for gross revenue (over

\$40.000), for fewer glitches (one, when the quartet shell got caught in the curtains as it was being raised during the evening show and became a 'bouncing shell' for everyone to follow as it fluttered over the director's head), for the show program, which was first-rate and paid for itself, and for quality performances (by all participating groups)."

Chapter President John Pennington announced that the 1994 HOA retreat would be held at the Elms Resort in Excelsior Springs on the weekend of April 15-17. Our clinician would be Bill **Rashleigh** from the Kenosha staff. Sure wish I could have been there.

There was word of the passing of 2l-year HOA member **Bob Ford**, who died on March 13. Bob was 76 years old. He was an electronics engineer for the Federal Aviation Administration for 30 vears.

Membership VP Ron McIntire provided a brief bio of new member Jon Gathright, an experienced barbershopper (he was a lead), but Ron didn't reveal where John got his experience. Ron also reported that John was self-employed but didn't say what he did for a living. Anyhow, we're certainly happy he's still with us, aren't we, guys?

Your editor reported that Joyce's back surgery was a complete disaster. She was having more pain than she had prior to the operation. (Wade promised that he's back with the chorus in time to prepare for the fall district contest, but he never made it, did he?)

### **Twenty Years Ago:** April, 1984

Two major events were on the agenda for the Heart of America Chorus. The first was a "Fun Time" show to be held on May 19 at the National Guard Armory at 7600 Ozark Road in Kansas city, Missouri. This was my first chapter activity after joining the chapter and I recall **Jim Bell** referring to it as a "wine and cheese" affair. However, I also recall that attendance was quite deplorable.

Chapter quartets performing on the show were the Prairie Crooners, the K.C. Connection, Special *Touch* and the *Elder Statesmen*.

The second major activity was preparation for the international convention in St. Louis. It appears that the convention chairman was **Ed** Sundermeyer who had an article in this issue of *Harmonotes* (**Dale Neuman** was the editor) about the arrangements for rooms at the Rodeway Inn and plans for a Saturday evening banquet.

### Thirty-Five Years Ago: April, 1969

Editor Dave Ritz published an article by Chapter President Bernie Geier that included the names of 60 HOA barbershoppers, including Director **Don Webb**, who would be on the risers with the chorus for the annual show coming up during Harmony Week. A comparison with the 2002 chapter directory indicates that nine of the guys are still on the roster, although only a few (Ron Abel and Bruce Wenner, to name a couple). Bernie continues as follows "... the music is outstanding and Henry's Hallucination is something else! Leave it to a DJ to come up with a giant Victrola!" Now who do you suppose he was talking about?

The April 1969 edition of Harmonotes also contained a tribute to the four members of the Hi-Landers, of the Denver chapter and current CSD guartet champs, who died in an airplane crash on March 22. The current

Denver chapter president and the CSD executive vice president were also killed in the crash. The article also tells us the 16 children lost their fathers in the tragedy.~

Elsewhere in this issue, others have articles about how great our shows were on March 13, so I'm not going to do that. It's not that I don't agree, because I do. Overall, (quartets, chorus, sound system, flow, etc.) those were two of the best shows we've ever done. You should be very proud of what you accomplished over that weekend. You achieved a level of performance

(entertainment) seldom seen by HOA. Really! But, I said I wasn't going to talk about that.

What I do want to talk about is what's next. Sometimes, in years past, we have taken time off and relaxed a little after a successful show before we began to gear up for our next big event. Why should we do that? Why don't we take the momentum we've created with those two great performances and transition immediately into our drive for Louisville? Do you remember the goals we set for ourselves toward Louisville? They are to place in the top 10 and to achieve an overall average persong-per-judge score of 85. To help us do that, we have scheduled several coaching sessions between now and July:

Bill Biffle will return to Kansas City on Tuesday. April 6 and again in June (date TBD).

We're having a special Saturday session on May 8 with Presentation guru **Dwain Brobst** and former HOAer and much-in-demand Singing coach Don Kahl. What a day that should be!

Dwain will also return to KC on June 15 for a final tune-up session with us prior to Louisville.

There's a lot of positive energy in the chorus right now. We should capitalize on that, right? If we can take that energy, add to it the considerable skills and abilities we already have within the chorus and use our coaches to help us improve from there, what do you think we're capable of in Louisville? Exciting stuff, huh?

## **LOUISVILLE CHORUS ORDER**

The Preliminary Order of Appearance draw for the Chorus Contest in Louisville was made Friday, March 19. Present and participating in the drawing were Linda Neuenfeld, Kathy Gilliver, Ev Nau, Greg Lyne, Scott Hoge and myself. The first drawing was for the sequence of riser configurations and that sequence is 11, 7 and 9. The Preliminary Order of Appearance (with the number of risers behind the chorus name) is as follows:

1. Denver Mile High (11) 2. Northbrook (11) 3. Ambassadors of Harmony (11) 4. Banks of the Wabash (7) 5. Toronto Northern Lights (7) 6. Salem Senate-aires (7) 7. Alliance Ohio (7) 8. Batavia, NY(7) 9. Granite Statesmen (7) 10. Marietta, GA(7)11. Macomb County (7) 12. Westminister (7) 13. Saltaires (7) 14. Grand Central Chorus-BABS (7) 15. Great Northern Union (9) 16. *Heart of America* (9) 17. Alexandria Harmonizers (9) 18. Midwest Vocal Express (9) 19. Tampa Heralds of Harmony (9) 20. Houston Tidelanders (9) 21. Cincinnati Southern Gateway (9)

The Mic Testing chorus is the Brothers in Harmony from Easton, PA. There will be a performance after the contest by the current chorus champions, the Vocal Majority.

This is the Preliminary Order of Appearance because Article VIII (E) of the Contest and Judging Rules says the following: E. "A chorus participating in the International Chorus contest may request that it be permitted to sing at the beginning of the contest, after learning of its placement in the initial draw. If more than one chorus requests to sing at the beginning of the contest, a second drawing will be held among those choruses to determine the order in which those choruses will sing at the beginning of the contest.
