


We had a wonderful evening together with more than 130 men who came to practice on a typical Thursday evening. Jim was so excited that we were still enjoying an afterglow listening to *AOH* and *Gas House Gang* CD's at 3 a.m. when we rolled back into Kansas City. He also has contacts with a couple of men who may be able to help him out after he moves.

Upon arrival, former HOA member Brian Marston was there to greet us, and showed us to a place on the risers near his position. After warm-up, the chorus sang "Happy Together" and both of us were able to join in, as this was one of our songs at HOA. For the next two hours they worked over several songs from their repertoire. Then they took on their contest ballad, "If You Loved Me, Really Loved Me". After a time working it, they sang it through, and I was in barbershop heaven, adding my voice to the clear beautiful sound around me. At the end, Director Jim Henry gushed "That was just wonderful. You guys just won the International competition with that performance!"

While working one song, the chorus got about to the second page when Jim stopped them abruptly and said "You are singing heavy and it's going flat!" We've all heard that, haven't we? The next five minutes showed me why they are above us. Jim had each section do that part over until he was satisfied with it, then put it together, and that *Ambassador* sound was back. They were able

to recognize the problem and fix it with a minimum of frustration.

At the break, Jim Moynihan and I were among more than a dozen guests that were welcomed and given a handshake by many of the guys. Brian performed with his three young friends in his quartet "In Progress" as they sang "Hey, Look Me Over." Brian said he is doing well in his schooling and is now student teaching in a public school as he prepares himself for a career of teaching music.



One thing I noticed — it is no longer true that about a third of the men I remember from my days with AOH. Now that ratio is under 20%. When they passed out renewals, only three of the 20 or so were longer than my 18 years. The one man I went to first while planning this visit was among the missing; he told me it was simply too much for him and he was out of the chorus as of last year. He told me that all of the men are individually tested regularly, and if your voice starts to get weak or noisy due to advancing age, you are asked to step down. The chorus is adding new members all the time, but a like number

is coming off the risers to maintain the size of the chorus at its current 150-160 singers.

After the break, the chorus worked over songs for which substantial choreography was involved, and both of us took our leave and watched the action from the chairs. The last 45 minutes were given to working "76 Trombones," the contest up-tune. In the end, I accepted a reality — I could no longer consider myself able to sing and perform with this chorus. *Sing?* Sure, I'd love to do that and will continue to do so from time to time. *But dance?* No way. I just don't have it physically any more.

As we started the drive home, I talked to Jim and asked for his impressions. and he was quite excited about the prospect of singing with them. He took some time to talk with Jim Henry, who encouraged him, but made it clear he had a challenge to be able to perform with the chorus (including the choreography). His first challenge is to learn to sing a song available on their Website "I'd Love to Live in Loveland," then sing it at an acceptable quality level with three others in a quartet. Given he can do that, then and only then is he allowed to apply for membership and sing with the chorus at the rehearsals.

I wonder — how many of you reading this article could sing one of our songs with three other guys in a quartet with good quality? Each and every one of us ought to be able to sing our repertoire songs in a quartet setting. *The Ambassdaors* are where they are because each and every one of those 160 men are "quartet singers," and each one of them are dedicated to learning their craft as well as it can possibly be learned. If we are ever to compete at their level, we will have to do the same. ♥

Students Strike Gold at Harmony Explosion

To say that Harmony Explosion quartet performances are improving every year is not an exaggeration. The average number of quartets scoring 1,000 points or more out of a possible 1,200 in the past has been five. On March 7, there were twelve quartets that won gold medals with scores of 1,000 points or better. We were surprised to say the least, but delighted and thrilled at the quality of student performances

How could the gold medal count go from an average of five to twelve in one year? The answer is that scores have been moving upward for several years due to great teaching in our schools and increased student interest and hard work. I believe that the X-factor that has provided the boost that has put many of these quartets at another performance level is the quartet coaching that has been provided by members of HOA, KCCSA and other chapters in the KC area, Leavenworth and Salina. These coaches have been a great help to the students in their preparation for the quartet competition. Their work has supported the vocal music programs in our schools and promoted barbershop singing in our area.

I want to express my sincere gratitude to the members of HOA, KCCSA and the Leavenworth chapter for giving up a part or all of their Saturday on March 7 to provide a great vocal music experience for students and to promote barbershop singing in our area. Harmony Explosion was a success because of you.

Note that the baritone of the winning junior high girls quartet, *Accidentals*, was **Sarah Meier**, daughter of our own **Jerry Meier**, who did yeoman work in organizing coaches for the Harmony Explosion.

TEN YEARS AGO: APRIL, 1999

Coordinator **Al Higgins** reports that "almost 240 area junior and senior high school boys and girls took part in "Harmony Explosion III." Al says that "what will also be remembered is

that 28 quartets and two mass choruses received coaching and direction from **Jim Bagby, Gordon Lankenau, Rich Lamer** (director of the Overland Stage Chorus), **Mark Fortino, John Fortino, Micah Jeppesen,** and **Barry Moore** (all from the *12th Street Rag*) and others. To show how this annual event had grown in attendance, Al reminded us that two years ago, "We had 80 students show up and six quartets were coached and competed." What an accomplishment!

TWENTY YEARS AGO: APRIL, 1989

Whatever happened to the International theme song, "Keep the Whole World Singing?" Some of you old-timers will remember that this song was always sung by a chorus as the last item on the program of their annual show. It was also

sung as the last number at the end of the Saturday night program at International and district contests. I've been away from the *HOA* chapter meetings for so long now that it wasn't until I came upon a short item in the April 1989 edition of *Harmonotes* in which the then editor commented that the theme song should be a part of our annual show program. Guess nobody else missed it.

FORTY YEARS AGO: APRIL, 1969

How many of you remember the tragedy on March 22, 1969, that took the lives of all of the members of the current Central States District quartet champions, the *Highlanders* of the Denver chapter? An entire page of this edition of *Harmonotes* was dedicated to an account of the crash of the airplane that was carrying the quartet members, along with **Larry Detweiller**, current president of the Denver chapter, and **Daryl Stafford**, executive vice president of the district. The group was en route to aid the Durango chapter in changing their "license status" to that of a regular chapter of the BHS. The quartet members were **Karl Penner**, tenor, **Wayne Hood**, lead, **Hugh Hohnstein**, baritone, and **Russ Thompson**, bass. The only survivors were Detweiller and Stafford. •

HIOA Financial Corner

Everyone complains that the recent financial system bailout is designed to help large corporations and the banking industry but doesn't do anything for us "small guys".

True or not, the bailout <u>has</u> provided a creative way for individuals age 70-1/2 and older to make direct transfers from their IRA to non-profit organizations. Unfortunately, you must act before the end of this year to take advantage of it.


This tax code innovation, called the **IRA Charitable Roll-over**, was created in 2006, expired after 2007, and was extended through 2009 in the first bailout bill in October 2008.

The highlights are:

- 1. You may transfer up to \$100,000 to the charity of your choice without having to recognize it as income.
- 2. Any transfer counts toward the annual minimum distribution (RMDs) required after age 70-1/2.
- 3. The transfers must be made directly to the charity and can only come from an IRA. Funds from a 401k or 403b must first be rolled into an IRA and then transferred.
- 4. The option expires on December 31, 2009.

One caveat. Although the IRA Charitable Rollover has been called a "no-brainer" for philanthropic taxpayers, the suspension of required minimum distributions for 2009 has muddied the waters a bit. However, there are still excellent reasons to use it (one example: taking money from an IRA to make a donation increases your adjusted gross income, which could reduce your ability to use tax benefits such as deductions for medical bills – the IRA Charitable Rollover doesn't do this).

Check with your financial advisor to see if this works for you. We hope it does, and that you consider *HOA* as one of your charitable choices.

America Harmony Movie: VP Kent Miller:

HOA has completed entry forms for participation in the America Harmony movie but the BHS has not provided any guidance.

Annual Four Person Scramble Golf Tournament – Exec VP Kent Miller:

- · Channel TV4 has agreed to publicize the golf tournament.
- · Hole sponsors are needed and posters will be available soon for distribution.
- · The *HOA* website is promoting the tournament news and online sign ups.

Harmony Explosion! (HE!) - Past President Tony Strub:

- The new scoring format using plateaus instead of rank order for the Festival was well received.
- The only problem experienced was a lack of gold medals but more have been ordered and will be delivered to the schools.

Foundations & Grants – Exec VP Kent Miller:

The committee is working on plans to write grant proposals for the Francis Family and the Truman Community Foundations.



Fund Raising & Annual Contribution Campaign (ACC) – VP Brad Dawdy:

A final version of the fund raiser letter will be submitted to the Board soon for consideration. If approved, the mailing date will be March 17, 2009. A list of persons to serve on the Fundraising/Sponsorship Committee has been drawn up.

2008 Holiday Harmony Spectacular - Mike Schumacher:

- · An in-depth show report was submitted to the Board of Directors.
- · Attendance for the matinee was 795, and 549 for the evening show. *HOA's* profit share was \$8,410.80.
- The Board agreed that the 2009 Holiday Harmony Spectacular will be December 11-12, 2009.

2009 Singing Valentines - Singing Valentine Chairman John Erwine:

- · HOA quartets delivered 117 Singing Valentines and KCCSA delivered 14.
- · A complete financial report will be filed at the April Board meeting. Estimated gross is \$8,200, estimated NET for *HOA* is \$2,500.


