The John Cross award went to **John Erwine**, our outgoing Membership Vice President and



incoming Executive Vice President. John is the closest to a John Cross we've seen for some His time. attendance has been exemplary,

and since he joined the chapter he has been pitching in on the jobs nobody wants to do. Some of them are really big jobs, like his officer positions, and especially his taking charge of Singing Valentines. John more than lives up to the standard set by John Cross, and he does not inflict foul-tasting coffee on us. (You old-timers will understand; if you don't get it, ask an old-timer.)

The Ozzie Award for musical service is only presented in a year in which there is a member who meets the high standards for the honor. This was one of those years.



Jerry Garrard is a natural for the award. Jerry has been involved in music all his life, and when he joined the chapter he immediately assumed the

He has honed his directing skills at Harmony University and as director of the Leavenworth chorus (very successfully – under his direction they have been the most improved chorus in CSD two years in a row). Jerry is our Assistant Director, and his talent and enthusiasm make him very effective in front of the chorus. He is also an accomplished quartetter, singing with *New & Used Parts, Sound Alibi, Mighty Fine*, and the current CSD 2nd place *ListenUp!*.


The Barbershopper Of The Year Award is presented in a given year,

The bar is so high that the Joe Stern Award has only been awarded twice (to Gil Lefholz and Dan Henry **Bowser**) before this year. This year produced our third winner - our emeritus director, Jim Bagby. For most of his 40 years in the chapter Jim has been our director, leading us regularly to district championships and International appearances, including our highest International finishes ever - sixth place in 1981, and seventh in 1991. His skills and accomplishments have earned him Society certification as a Master Director, and he shares his talent by traveling around the country teaching others how to be successful chorus directors. In 2008 Jim received the Joe Liles Lifetime Achievement Award, the most prestigious honor that the Barbershop Harmony Society can bestow on a chorus director. Jim won a gold medal in 1986 with one of the most entertaining quartets in the Society's history, the Rural Route 4. He is a regular faculty member at Harmony University, where he teaches classes in coaching and tag singing. He is a highly respected coach, and is widely sought after for coaching by choruses and quartets all over the country. Jim began judging in the Stage Presence category, and then (when the new categories were instituted) he became a certified Presentation judge, a duty he still performs. Throughout all of this he has found time and energy to provide important administrative service, including as chapter president and International Board Member. Jim is one of the most loved and respected men in the Society, and this chapter is privileged to be able to add the Joe Stern Award to his resume.

So, Bill installed the officers and beckoned director David Krause to join those men in pledging to work for the betterment of the chapter. Music VP Mark Fortino and David both addressed the importance of the continued improvement of the chorus. Bruce Wenner, Awards Committee Chairman, acknowledged past award recipients and orchestrated the recognition of John Erwine as recipient of the John Cross Award, Jerry **Garrard** as the recipient of the Oz Newgard Award and also one of the few men who has now received all three of these awards, and myself as


the recipient of the Barbershopper of the Year award. Then, to everybody's surprise, Bruce announces


By Board resolution, this year all of the proceeds from the

Clarence Bond

Long-time former member of *HOA*, Clarence Bond, died December 30, 2010 following surgery to remove a tumor. During his lifetime, Clarence sang in the Glee Club at Wyandotte High School and sang with his wife at Judson Baptist Church.

From 1982 to 1992 he was an active member of the Kansas City Chapter and served as Sunshine chairman for a number of years. He sang lead in the *Heart of America Chorus* and in the mid 1980s sang with the *Harmony Handful*. He was the Scribe for the *Harmony Handful* (meaning he wrote articles for the *Harmonotes*) several years running to keep *HOA* up to date on '*Handful* activities.

The chorus last saw Clarence in December 2004 when he stopped by to hear *HOA* sing for the Salvation Army at Metro North Mall. Those who were fortunate enough to know Clarence will miss him.

It's always fun to be involved with the actual nuts and bolts of putting on this affair; being in a delivering quartet, a driver, or working in the HQ.



The Annual Music Team Plan for 2011 was submitted and accepted. It included coaching dates, music selection, performance objectives, and individual feedback.

The following 2010 proposed standards are being reviewed by the Board.

HOA Performing Chorus Standards

- The Performing Chorus members will have three weeks from the time the sheet music and the learning media b come available to learn a new song before the song is sung for the first time.
- Members will be asked to learn no more than one song in any three-week period.
- To maintain membership in the Performing Chorus, a member must attend at least 65% of the chapter meetings.
- To maintain membership in the Performing Chorus, a member must record both new contest songs and review them on his own. He will promptly record and turn in any passage or entire song to his section leader upon request.
- The Music Team will do its best to give the members a list of two songs that they need to focus on for the following week.
- Only members of the Performing Chorus will be allowed on the risers. Guests may be on the rises after undergoing an initial voice placement by the director or other member of the Music Team.
- The Music Team will not approve a new or dual member application before qualifying the person for the Performing Chorus.

Singing Valentines Quartet Standards:

- Quartets with all four members in the Performing Chorus, regardless of the part they are singing, are automatically approved as Singing Valentine Quartet.
- If one or more members of a Singing Valentine quartet are not in the Performing Chorus, the quartet must be approved by the Music Team by auditioning in front of the chorus or a member of the team. The Music Team reserves the right to make exceptions to this rule.

 A new chapter web page explaining chapter membership, auditions, HOA Performing Chorus membership and retention with links to audition sheet music and learning media downloads is/being drafted and is forthcoming.

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It Just Gets Better... by John Erwine

How interesting can an everyday barbershop meeting and rehearsal get? It seems to me we're beginning to get a small glimpse of just that. I think it all started a few months ago. The decision was made to conduct business, sing tags and socialize from 7:00-7:30. Then promptly at 7:30, introduction of guests, tune ups and the rehearsal would begin.

Being in the outer foyer even on that first evening of those newly announced hours, I heard what I thought was the chorus starting early. Thinking I was either late with guest intros or missing something I had forgotten about, I went down the steps, opened the door and there it was; a whole bunch of guys just hanging around singing one of the numbers we were learning in a very impromptu and casual moment. Then a few minutes later some of the guys were singing tags out in the foyer.

Since then, I can't recollect a week that someone wasn't there early singing tags. More recently, it's been lots of guys singing lots of tags. And the same thing is happening after the rehearsal is over. And even better than that, most of these guys are younger than me; young enough to be my grandkids!

Our own two- year member **Ted Simon** recently sent this to me when I earlier in the year asked for testimonials as to how you became a member of *HOA* and what keeps you here:

"...Have you ever wondered why performers do what they do? It's for a number of reasons. First and foremost, they love what they do. They get to show off their particular talent(s) to thousands who want to watch, listen and be entertained. Secondly is, the love to perform. They get a thrill from the audience watching them. (I guess this goes, in part, to the first reason.) Third...well, really there is no second or third. Everything is about the first!

I joined *Heart of America Chorus* because I love to sing. I enjoy singing almost any type or style of music. What I truly enjoy about barbershop music is the fact that almost any tune, be it classic or contemporary, can be made into a barbershop style.

When I was invited to my first After Glow, I was taught a tag. I sang with three other guys. When we finished, I was approached by two of them to consider joining the chorus. At the time, my evenings were tied up, but that didn't stop me from constantly thinking about joining.

The time came for my evenings to be freed up, so I came to the meetings as a guest. I enjoyed watching the guys talk about music, people they knew, concerts they either attended or performed, etc. I liked what I saw and loved what I heard; the harmony, the exactness of notes. This is what I would like to do.

Barbershop singing is not something anyone can just jump into and sound good. It takes discipline, practice and listening to those around you. With the help of the music team, the director and assistant directors and section leaders, I can say that I am a barbershop singer. I did not say I was a good barbershop singer, and I still have quite a distance to travel to become an accomplished barbershopper, but I am on my way!"

Dan Henry Bowser, Jim Bagby and untold others have always professed that if you can grab a guest, get him with three other guys and teach him just a simple tag and ring the snot out of it—you've got him. Well guess what—it worked for Ted and it seems to be working every Tuesday night for many others.

It appears to me this chorus is migrating toward something such as the barbershop "forefathers" experienced way back in those early days; just enjoying an unexpected singing experience, casual conversation with newly found and old friends, then putting all those voices together to create something wonderful.
