#### 2018 HARMONY HOLIDAY SPECTACULAR (HHS) SHOW

The HHS show for 2018 (Dec. 1) was once again a rousing success for both *HOA* and for *KC Chorus (Sweet Adelines)*. Total profits from the show were \$4,660. Since *HOA* had some additional expenses for the show (uniforms, etc.) the profits were not quite evenly split: *KC Chorus* made \$2,667 and *HOA* cleared \$1,993.

The total number of tickets sold were 675, almost exactly the same as 2017, and somewhat greater than 2016. This is quite a bit under our record turnouts when we used to put 200 people on stage and sold out two performances at Unity in a single day. However, the mood of both choruses is very upbeat, and we are hopeful that greater days are ahead as both choruses continue to grow! One of the other positives about the ticket selling contest is that 20 members of *HOA* sold 10 or more tickets, and between the men and women, 472 of the total tickets sold were sold by a participant who sold 10 or more tickets to the show, indicating a very strong commitment to making the HHS a financial success! **Michele Hunget**, who sold a whopping 40 tickets to the show, also won the drawing for the ticket selling contest!

Our headliner quartet was *Class Ring*, who had just come from their Fall competition winning the international crown as queens of *Sweet Adelines* for 2019. They were extremely well received by all of the show attendees.

# **Joe Stern Lifetime Acheivement Award for 2018** ...goes to Mike Mathieu!

Mike joined the Society 50 years ago while in the Sheboygan chapter and for the last 36 years he's been in HOA.

Mike and his wife **Jan** have three sons, all of which have been barbershoppers for many years.

Mike was chapter president two years 1991 and 1992 and was the HOA Barbershopper of the year in 1990. During his tenure in HOA he has been on or chaired just about every significant committee. I think most everyone who knows him, knows him as an idea man.

He is tireless in everything he does. He was chorus manager a number of years, served on the very important International Events Committee; has served as a CSD board member and as CSD Events Vice-President. The last two times HOA hosted the BHS International Convention, he was an International Convention co-chair in 2000 and the International Convention chairman in 2011.

Throughout the years he's has been in many quartets, to name a few, Yowza!, Armchair Chorderbacks (CSD Senior Quartet Champions), On The Edge, Uranium (with the late HOA president **John Stucker**), Mother's Guys, Jazzin' Around, and Good Vibrations. He is also a member of the Ancient Harmonious Society of Woodshedders (AHSOW).

One of his greatest accomplishments was implementing a replacement program for Singing and Ringing of bells for the Salvation Army in local Kansas City shopping malls to a Caroling Caravan which he co-chairs with **Bob Burdick**. The Caravan sings 30-minute concerts at six retirement facilities in one day. This year alone the Caravan has received over \$23,000 for the Salvation Army's Bell Ringing Campaign. Through the years he has received a multitude of Salvation Army Awards including highest award their Salvation Army's Favorite son award in appreciation for his service.



Congratulations again to **Mike Mathieu** for receiving *HOA's* highest honor. . . The Joe Stern Lifetime Achievement Award for 2018!












































#### **ARE YOU A** HARMONY EXPLOSION VOLUNTEER?

**Harmony Explosion! 2019** is right around the corner. Here are some of the simple but important assignments that make Harmony Explosion! run. Please notify Jerry Meier if you can help — it's appreciated by everyone involved.

- 1. Can you be an **Enthusiastic Audience Member?** Please make plans to attend, even if you do not receive a specific work assignment that day. Your presence gives the kids moral support when singing for a larger, loving audience!
- 2. Wanna help set up / serve lunch? Can you be a back-up Judge (you get simple, basic instructions)? Can you operate a laptop running Excel? Wanna operate a video camera or take pictures? Wanna hang signs inside the building? Can you escort the kids to the Warm-up Rooms and then to the stage? Wanna help back stage? Can you be an Usher in the Main Auditorium or Flex Theatre?
- 3. Can you be a **Quartet Coach?** It's easier than you think! Simply share your barbershop knowledge with the students — it's the most beneficial service that we can provide. Your presence with a young quartet will help the students practice their songs with a purpose. Just one or two days prior to Feb. 16 is all it takes — usually at 3pm during the school day (sometimes at 7 am). Just 30 minutes of coaching can make a huge difference in a student's ability to sing on stage. Don't you wish that someone would have coached you when YOU were in school? Please talk to Jerry Meier in person to get more information.

All Harmony Explosion! volunteers (those of you with a specific work assignment) must complete the online training. Please complete the training well before THE Saturday in February. I will send out the necessary details upon arrival from Headquarters.





The Kansas City Chapter's largest and most active affiliate group, the New Harmony Handful, has averaged 19 performances per year in its first 10 years of operation, according to historian Bob Howard. But the number is climbing.

The NHH was out to churches, retirement and nursing homes, senior citizen organizations and other primarily daytime groups 25 times in 2017 and 21 times last year. And we're already booked three times in February. Our monthly meetings at Blue Ridge Presbyterian Church are always lively and busy as we

woodshed, warm up with tags and rehearse songs the guys have (mostly) learned on their own. We're also proud of our two active quartets, A Cappella Fellas and 4 in Harmony. One or the other appears at every performance we do. We have 21 members as we begin year No. 11.

Bass **Bart Bartholomew** joined us last year. Numerically, he replaces **Val Putzier**, an original and wonderful guy who died in 2017. **Jan Putzier** and her daughter, **Suzie**, came to our December Christmas banquet at Venue 208, in the Red Bridge shopping center — across from the church where HOA used to meet. **Dave Hokanson** did a bangup job of hosting and catering the meal, while wives and significant others brought side dishes. We had over 40 in attendance.

The highlight of the evening was presentation of the annual Harmony Hero award to **Bob Murphy**, who has earned the admiration of all for the extra effort he has to make just to show up for virtually every function of the *NHH*. In his remarks leading to the presentation, *Handful* President **Tony Strub** noted, "I think I work hard for the *Handful*. Then I look at Bob on his hand crutches and see how much he puts in this. It just makes me want to try harder."

Every NHH member must be a member of HOA or the new Society for the Preservation and Propagation of Barbershop Singing in the United States (SPBBSQSUS). As a side note, Rich Huyck, Jim Davis, Marty Oldehoeft and Director **Jim Bagby** are SPBBSQSUS members. Bagby attended the SPBB first convention at San Antonio in January.

- 1. An extremely famous radio (and later TV) variety show host was inducted. Name him. For extra credit, what distinguished him as worthy of honorary membership? Hint--he was a local boy who resided in Hasbrouck Heights in his youth.
- 2. A family foursome who appeared at several Society international competitions as kids and brought the house down (but never competed) went on to show biz fame. Who are they? Hint—one of the brothers plus his sister remain in the show biz spot light to this day. These two, however, are younger than the original four brothers who sang barbershop.
- 3. A recent inductee made his mark in gospel music. Name him.
- 4. Three singers from three a capella groups who scaled the popular music heights - the first two in the 1950's, the third starting in the late 1950's but still at it! - were inducted. Name them and their groups.

One of the Chordettes fell in love with Walter and down the aisle they went.
- 2. *The Osmond Brothers* in 1986. The two younger siblings who still remain in the public eye are **Donny** and **Marie**.
- 3. **Bill Gaithe**r in 2006
- 4. **Gene Puerling** of the *Hi-Los* (and also of *Singers Unlimited*) in 2004, Bob Flanigan of the Four Freshmen in 2003, and **Jim Pike** of the *Lettermen* in 1996.

## **NEW MEMBER FLYER**

For some time now, we have all watched our chapter membership decline from well over 150 members in the 1980s and 90s to fewer

than 100 today. Putting 100 men on stage at a show or contest then was the norm.

The reasons for the decline are many, but one fact is evident: not enough singers are coming into the chapter, let alone visiting. If you are among those who complain that Central Standard has robbed us of our membership, you miss the point. Iron is magnetizedwhen the molecules in the material align themselves in the same direction. Thus, Central Standard's mission has aligned itself with competition. That's great. They attract members who want to compete at a higher level. Kansas City's tradition aligns itself with entertaining shows, community service and promoting Kansas City.

Unfortunately our members are not being replaced at a rate to support the decline. No one can fault a member for moving to any other chapter if it fits their mission. However, who better represents Kansas City, Missouri? Answer: The Kansas City Chapter and HOA. We may compete at a lower level but I favor the community approach. I would bet that most, if not all, in our chapter do too.
