Site Offers Interesting Pre-Society Recordings

If you're interested in historical recordings, go to www.gutenberg.org, where you can find a few.

From the home page, scroll down to 'online book catalog' and click on that. Under categories, click on 'music, recorded.' The recordings are in alphabetic order by the performer's name. I found four recordings by three groups. They're listed as: Colored Quartet (Name Unknown), Fisk University Jubilee Quartette, and Premier Quartet. There aren't any dates that I could find but they were recorded on either Edison Ambersol cylinders or Edison Diamond disks. The first Ambersol cylinders were made in 1908 and the disks in 1914.

The Edison Company went out of business in 1929, so that provides a range of dates. I sent these to David Krause and he seems to think the lead singer on 'Moonlight Bay' is a man called **Billy Murray**. I'll have to take his word for it. This site does have several solo recordings by Murray. It also contains thousands of public domain books, as well as recordings and even some sheet music.

Just thought I'd pass this along.



SINGING VALENTINES – Always Rewarding

Preparation for this great event usually begins in October. First my procedure manual is broken out and dusted off, all categories are reviewed in general, notes and suggestions taken during last season are re-read. Gradually the cobwebs are swept away and things begin to come into focus for the approaching year.

By November I have a general timeline of things that have to occur in order to make this a successful event. A headquarters location has to be obtained, candy secured and flowers found. We've been fortunate the last two years – all of these have been donated at no cost to the chapter; headquarters: **Bank of Blue Valley**, candy: **Russell Stover Candy**, flowers: **Flowerama**.

Continuing on into December, I begin the submission of requests to various past or potential new sponsors for donations. These are included in the drawing for the recipients of the singing parcels of love. Again this year **Helzberg Diamonds** donated a diamond pendant. Sweetheart hotel packages were donated by **DoubleTree Hilton, Marriott Downtown, Hyatt Regency Crown Center, Residence Inn by Marriott** and **Westin Crown Center**.

By now you might imagine what a cost savings these donations mean to the success of this event and the great marketing tool we have with the drawing.

Add to this the great effort from the Marketing team in the preparation of email teasers, flyers, pocket cards, banners, and radio and TV spots.

Also in late December and early January we are working to assure that telephone orders may be taken properly. Next the web site has to be updated and operational, and all other related software programs need to be in place and tested. Our own **Vince Perry** takes care of those things. At

the same time, we are recruiting and forming quartets to deliver the valentines and obtaining volunteers to help at headquarters.

Then in late January and into February, right up to the day we overtake headquarters, orders are coming in through

Vince's computers to be logged, numbered and the appropriate amount charged to the customer. Then they are forwarded to me where I also log them and review them for potential conflicting or incomplete information.

Suddenly, it's "*Showtime.*"

Computers, printers, office supplies and orders are all moved into the headquarters location. The orders are routed; supplies for each delivery given to each delivering quartet and the deliveries begin.

Then almost as suddenly as it began, it's all over. There is that huge sigh of relief; a great feeling of satisfaction that we've again been able to not only deliver tokens of love to those around us, but contribute 25% of the net proceeds to **Children's Mercy Hospital**. Over the next few days we begin hearing stories of various deliveries and how it affected recipients in different ways – all of them rewarding.

This year I saw something a little different than in the past. On Valentine's Day there was a flurry of last minute orders prompted solely by a delivery that someone witnessed. I attribute that to the

excellent preparation and delivery of the participating quartets.

I can't thank all of you enough who participated in even the smallest way for making this an annual success. Those of you who participated in the largest of ways know who you are – and I know who you all are. I do thank you all! ♥

As of Feb. 23, after seven drawings (three since last report):


The total Harmony Foundation contribution since the last report: \$59.


