Mike and Linda Schumacher** were again helping with the risers, quartet pattern and just about everything else not obviously visible. We had a great deal of assistance from the Kansas City Chorus of Sweet Adelines. Many thanks to the *Cody Choraliers* for serving lunch, the exceptional judging panel, the quartets who worked as clinicians preparing the youth for this event and many others who helped make this such a success; also to the HOA chorus for performing as part of the event. It was a great contribution to the young people, perhaps experiencing this for the first time.

Three days later we welcomed **Joe Connelly** as our coach. I've never seen so many teeth and as much energy in all my life. The evening just flew by. At the end of our three hour session, we were all whipped, but I think Joe was just getting warmed up. Frankly, I think as pumped as we were, we probably could have gone another hour or so; another great evening.

The following Tuesday we hosted **Keith Snode**, representing Manhattan Concert Productions, and other welcome guests with a mini performance to introduce him to our talent. Keith is our contact for our Carnegie trip in December. He gave us an overall description of the event and answered questions from members and wives as alike.

On April 13th we celebrated the chapter's 75th anniversary with our annual show, 75 Years of Harmony, again in Yardley Hall. Our featured guest quartet was *Crossroads*, and boy, have they still got it! One of the additional pleasantries we extended was to introduce and hear perform, the winning

quartets from Harmony Explosion. The audience really loved them. Perhaps the greatest part of the evening was the finale. 

A new format was introduced this year to emphasized participation and fun more than competition. Three divisions were created to encourage participation at the younger age levels: 8<sup>th</sup> Grade and Under; 10<sup>th</sup> Grade and Under; 12<sup>th</sup> Grade and Under. Quartets in the 8<sup>th</sup> Grade and Under division were also allowed to compete with 4 or 5 or 6 or 7 or 8 members. In addition, they did not have to be judged in the same category as Freshmen! Likewise, Freshmen and Sophomores did not have to be judged with Juniors or Seniors! Most importantly, this change allowed for more quartets to qualify for Gold, Silver, and Bronze medals!

One goal for this year was to provide plenty of examples of a cappella barbershop singing for the students, the parents, and the music educators — everyone participated to accomplish this goal. (Continued on page 7 )

The Kansas City Chorus of Sweet Adelines started the day on stage at 9am by singing two songs to delight the audience. Next ZING! (the 2010 Sweet Adelines International Quartet Champions) stepped on stage and performed a mini-concert to get everyone fired up for the day's activities. Susan Ives and Jerry Garrard lead a 30-minute warm-up sessions for the respective girls and boys groups prior to the preliminary contest rounds. Forty quartets performed in the prelims and twenty-one qualified for the finals. The *Heart of America Chorus* sang for the audience prior to the announcement of the 21 finalists. The Cody Choraliers serenaded the participants during lunch, which was catered by the Olive Garden of Olathe. After lunch, *Premium Blend* gathered the participants back into the auditorium for their mini-concert.

BoomTown helped to teach Barbershop Tags to the boys while ZING! was teaching a few tags to the girls prior to the finals. After the finals were done, ALL of the girls gathered on stage to sing their tags, and the boys did the same (with assistance from BoomTown). - In 2011 they (Hearing and Speech Clinic) served well over 8,000 children, from birth to 18 years old, hailing from 57 counties of Missouri and 69 counties in Kansas.
- In 2011 they helped train 35 medical students and residents in speech and language disorders, and intervention. Student interns in the field of speech and language pathology from five different universities completed an internship through their clinic.
- In October 2012 the Hearing and Speech program added an outpatient clinic at its Children's Mercy East facility in Independence, MO, augmenting services already available at its four other facilities.

One 16 year old wrote about the day when, at three years old, he got his first hearing aid through the Speech and Hearing Clinic. "That night, the family went to

the amusement park Worlds of Fun, a place with lots of flashing lights, lots of tall spinning things, and lots and lots of sound. With so many different things that I had never seen or HEARD before. it was as if somebody had turned on the world!"

# Wade Dexter Celebrates 90th Birthday!

**Wade Dexter** celebrated his 90th birthday at Mt. Zion Baptist Church in Edgerton, MO, Sunday, May 5, 2013. He was surrounded by many of his friends and family, and the New Har-

mony Handful. His son Paul said of the occasion. "While Dad had forgotten the event by the next morning, I know he appreciated and understood what was going on. He was moved to tears several times."

At the celebration, there was time to visit and reminisce, enjoy a few words from the pastor, hear songs by the Harmony Handful and sing the traditional "Happy Birthday" to Wade.

# Paul recounts his father's life history:

Wade Dexter was born in Elderon, Wisconsin, in 1923, the oldest of three children. His father was a school teacher and principal; his mother a homemaker. He attended high school in Oshkosh where he played the trombone and sang in the a cappella choir and graduated in 1941. It was in the high school band that he met Jovce Elmer the girl he would share 65 years of marriage with until her death in 2007.

He was inducted into the U.S. Army in 1943 and after serving in Europe during WWII he accepted a commission in the Regular Army as an officer in the Medical Service

Corp. His assignments included Japan, Iran, Fort Leavenworth and Korea. In Korea, he was responsible for coordinating the medical debriefing of the crew of the U.S. intelligence-gathering ship, the USS Pueblo. The North Koreans had captured the crew in 1968 and held them for 11 months until they were released in 1969. He retired from the Army as Lt. Colonel in 1969.

Wade joined the barbershop society in 1965 through the St. Joseph Missouri chapter and later held every chapter office except treasurer in the now defunct Lawrence chapter. In 1983.

he transferred his membership to the Kansas City chapter and sang bass in the *Heart of America Chorus*. He and Joyce lived in Lawrence for almost 30 years until Joyce's health began to fail

in 1997 and they moved to Liberty to be near Paul and his wife Karen. a registered nurse. After Joyce died in 2007, he moved in with Paul in Trimble, MO when he could no longer care for himself, a victim of Alzheimer's.

Many members of HOA will remember Wade as the editor of the Lawrence Chapter bulletin and later the Harmonotes in the Kansas City Chapter until 1997 when that duty was passed to **Todd Anderson**. From about 1997 until October 2010 he wrote a column for the Harmonotes called "A Look at the Past in *Harmonotes*," and a column in the CSD Serenade called "Bulletin Browsing" When asked to describe his most vivid barbershop memory, he didn't hesitate in saying that having Harmonotes picked as the best bulletin in the Society in 1988 when he was the editor couldn't be topped by any other barbershopping experience he'd had.

Wade and Joyce were parents of two sons, both of whom are former barbershoppers. Steve flies a helicopter for a medevac unit near Augusta, Gorgia, and Paul works for Banta Publications in Liberty. MO.

Wade's musical career includes singing with the St. Joe Pony Ex-

pressmen, two St. Joe quartets—the Joe Town Four, and the Empire Four—while he was stationed at Ft. Leavenworth in the 1960s, the Lawrence Barberhawks and the Heart of America Chorus in Kansas City.

On a related note: Wade stopped by the rehearsal hall to watch the April 30 Spring Fling and the chorus had an opportunity to sing Happy Birthday and wish him well at the end of the evening.

# ED SUNDERMEYER



If you had ever met Ed Sundermeyer you would have liked him instantly. He had a soft voice, a quick wit and a friendly demeanor. He sang lead in The Elder Statesmen quartet in the early 1980s and in the Crosstown Four, with Ron Abel, Dale Neuman and Fred Whisman from 1987 until 2000. The quartet continues today with Gordy Coleman replacing Ed and Val Putzier taking over Fred's spot. The Crosstown Four won first place in the newly formed CSD Senior's Quartet Contest in 1989. Ed also sang in the first version of the Harmonv Handful.

Ed was a low-key, always smiling, do-anything-to-help guy, and his wife Ruth was a rough-exterior, heart-of-gold Heartbeat of the year. After Ruth died about 10 years ago, Ed's son, a high-powered government attorney inside the beltway moved Ed in with him then later to an assisted living facility.

He served on the board of directors in the late 1980s and early '90s and was HOA Barbershopper of the Year in 1985. Ed sundermeyer died in the first week of April, 2013, in Washington D.C. at the age of 96. He is a big part of the heritage of the Kansas City Chapter and the Heart of America Chorus.




