Just three days later, June 18, we celebrated the Diamond Jubilee of not only the Barbershop Harmony Society, but the formation of the Kansas City Chapter. We are perhaps the most fortunate chapter in the Society, for in Kansas City in the old lobby of the Muehlebach Hotel is where it all began. I'm convinced that there are still old chords hanging around the stairwells. hallways and lobby, echoing from those original black and white floor tiles and highly polished hardwood walls. As for the Founder's plague, I'll bet they have to straighten it every few days.



Notables present were BHS Vice President, **Don Fuson**, CSD President, **Dean Beckman** and CSD Past President **Harvey Kiser**. CSD was well represented, not only with current, past and inactive local members, but from most every state in the district. Retired quartet High Definition performed a most rousing and reminiscent set of their highly regarded accomplishments. Historian and twice-past HOA Director, **David Krause**, presented another great history lesson pertinent to the event to an all-attentive audience.

Soon after, the *Heart of America Chorus* and Director, **Mark Fortino** took center stage. Perhaps I should say they took "center stairwell landing," much as I could imagine **O.C. Cash** and his Tulsa cronies might have done upon the installation of the Kansas City Chapter those 75 years ago. The evening ended with Director Emeritus **Jim Baqby** directing *That Old Quartet of Mine*. What an evening! Did I forget to mention – another great **Joe Mathieu** production?

A few days later, June 30, we were the guest performers of The Corbin Theatre Company in Liberty. This was the opening event of their annual week-long Independence Day celebration entitled "Celebrating Liberty." Also appearing was *Premium Blend*. What a great combination! The performance was held in a wonderful facility, the Liberty Community Center Theater. To finish out the early evening festivities, about 45 gathered at a local Mexican establishment to eat, relax, share memories and sing a few tags. Of course Premium Blend added to that occasion.

And what summer wouldn't be complete without our annual performance of Music in the Park, and competition with our friends – the cicadas! They must have had their own party, because I only saw a couple. The event was kicked off this year with a picnic organized by **Carl Turlin**. Making it a grand evening, the temperature was at least 15 degrees below last year which was about 106. Contributing to making it special was having the company of the Kansas City Chorus of Sweet Adeline's to share the stage with. Also performing were the quartets Premium Blend, Exit Strategy, Priorities, Four Good Friends and From the Heart. The evening culminated with the two choruses jointly singing Joy to the World.

Now can I take a breath? Well, no not really. We've still got so many things coming at us that sometimes it's hard to know what to do next. But after all, isn't that part of the fun?

A Review of International Results Compared to **Preliminary Results** by Jim Porter



The 2013 International competition at Toronto had 29 choruses and 1.575 singers. Scores: Top 5 average 91.37%, top 10 average 87.72%, top 20 average 84.45%.

In 2012 the Portland competition had 28

choruses and 1,473 singers. Scores: Top 5 average 92.65%, top 10 average 89.22%, top 20 average 86.00%.

In 2011 the Kansas City competition had 30 choruses and 1.659 singers. Scores: Top 5 average 91.88%, top 10 average 88.90%, top 20 average 85.45%.

Without the Dallas Vocal Majority and the Great Northern Union, plus recent champions Ambassadors of Harmony and Masters of Harmony, this year's competition offered opportunities for medals for several chapters that have not recently enjoyed that level of success. In addition, 2012 medalist choruses from Sweden and Elizabethtown, KY were not in this year's competition. *The Vocal Alliance* from Ohio took advantage, securing their first medal since 2004. The second five included several choruses that have not previously won a medal. including the Fremont Pathfinders, our Central States District representative this year.

All North American choruses qualified for International in their district competitions last fall. As has been typical in previous years, the top 10 choruses posted higher percentage scores at International than in the district competitions, while the other choruses posted scores similar to last fall. This year, the top 10 average was up by 1.97%, the second 10 average up 0.44% and the average for the rest was down 0.27% from their respective district scores.

The Westminster chorus qualified in October with 94.33%, a full 4.5% higher than Toronto Northern Lights, who posted 89.83%. Westminster matched its score in Toronto (94.30%), but Toronto closed the gap by improving to 94.37% and claimed the gold. Alexandria (3rd) and T.H.X (8th) also improved their qualifying scores by more than 4% and thereby moved up in the rankings. Last year's sensations, the Senate-Aires from Portland OR, on the other hand could not repeat and declined 2.74% to take 12th place. Others showing good improvement include Circle City Sound (+3.3%), The Marcsmen (+2.5%), Vocal Evolution (+2.8%), The Men of Independence (OH, +2.7%) and *The Mountaintown Singers* (+2.3%).

The 2013 quartet competition in Toronto featured 48 quartets. Average scores: Top 10: 86.55%. Top 20: 84.52%. All quartets: 80.15%.

The 2012 quartet competition in Portland featured 51 quartets. Average scores: Top 10: 87.78%. Top 20: 85.53%. All quartets: 80.65%. The 2011 quartet competition in Kansas City featured 50 quartets. Average scores: Top 10: 86.21%. Top 20: 84.57%. All quartets: 80.47%.

All North American quartets qualified for International this past spring

in their respective districts. In general, scores at International are higher than the qualifying scores, but the difference is small. Top 10: +0.61%. Top 20: +0.91%. All guartets: +0.28%.

The shifting of positions among the quartets is typically more dramatic than the choruses, and this year's competition is no exception. The overseas quartets are more difficult to analyze as they often qualify much earlier than the spring and it is difficult in some cases to get the qualifying scores. *Masterpiece* made the most noteworthy move, coming from 4th place in last year's competition to the gold medal, posting a 0.84% improvement over its qualifying score and passing Musical Island Boys and A Mighty Wind, who placed 2nd and 3rd last year. Our own *Premium Blend* moved from 21st place in the qualifying round to 17th by improving their qualifying score by 1.67%. Other quartets improving their score by a similar amount include Forefront (+1.5%), The Crush (+1.2%), After Hours (+1.9%), Instant Classic (+1.9%), Frank The Dog (+2.0%), The Con Men (+2.1%), County Line (+1.6%) and Surround Sound (+2.8%). On the other hand, those who fell short of expectations include Da Capo (-1.5%), GQ (-1.2%), Vocality (-1.1%), and Velvet Hammer (-1.2%).

The 2013 collegiate quartet competition in Toronto featured 26 quartets. Average scores: Top 10: 76.78%. Top 20: 74.55%. All quartets: 73.32%.

The 2012 collegiate quartet competition in Portland featured 23 quartets. Average scores: Top 10: 76.16%. Top 20: 73.10%. All quartets: 72.13%.

The 2011 collegiate quartet competition in Kansas City featured 21 quartets: Average scores: Top 10: 76.76%, Top 20: 73.73%. All quartets: 73.27%.

The Society Webpage showed qualifying scores for all quartets. Improvements over qualifying: Top 10: +1.60%. Top 20: +0.77%. All quartets: +0.32%.

The average for quartets 11 thru 26 was lower than the qualifying average.

Our own The New Edition showed an excellent improvement, +4.0% over their qualifying score. They therefore were able to win the 4th place medal after posting the 11th best qualifying score. All three quartets ahead of them also improved more than 3%. Phantom 5th took 5th with a 4.5% improvement.

Our own Brovertones showed the largest decline, -3.91% from their qualifying score. They were therefore 22nd in the competition after posting the 10th best qualifying score.

A PROCLAMATION RECOGNIZING BARBERSHOP HARMONY WEEK

WHEREAS, Kansas City's historic Muehlebach Notel was the site of a chance meeting between two Tulsa business leaders, O. C. Cash and Rupert Hall; and

WHEREAS, The Society for the Preservation and Encouragement of Barber Shop Quartet Singing in America, Inc. (SPEBSQSA)—known now as The Barbershop Harmony Society—was officially organized April 11, 1938, in Tulsa, Oklahoma;

WHEREAS, the Kansas City Chapter became the second chapter of SPEBSQSA on June 2, 1938; and

WHEREAS, what began as a small group has steadily blossomed into the world's largest all-male singing organization made up of individuals from all stations of life; and

WHEREAS, The Barbershop Harmony Society is dedicated to creating and encouraging harmony for people to enjoy all over the world through the universal language of music; and

WHEREAS, The Barbershop Harmony Society has actively preserved the barbershop quartet, a distinct style of vocal music that originated in North America and is now an American tradition; and

WHEREAS. The Barbershop Harmony Society promotes musical education through music scholarships and supports charitable foundations with the same mission; and

WHEREAS, The Barbershop Harmony Society is engaged in laudable civic service and enrichment of our cultural life through the fostering of traditional values in entertainment and community endeavors.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Sylvester James, Mayor of the City of Kansas City, Missouri, on behalf of the citizens of this great city and the City Council, do hereby proclaim April 7 - 13, 2013 as "Barbershop Harmony Week,"

Heart of America Barbershop Chorus and its Membership VP Jerry Meier represented the Central States District and the Barbershop Harmony Society by exhibiting at the Kansas Choral Directors Association (KCDA) Summer Conference in Topeka, KS in mid-July. Jerry set up a table-top booth in the exhibit hall and met with more than 50 choral directors that are members of the Kansas Choral Directors Association (KCDA).

There were two goals to accomplish:

- 1) Promote Youth in Harmony Events such as our very own Harmony Explosion! 2014
- 2) Promote the new partnership between the Barbershop Harmony Society and the American Choral Directors Association (as described in the Nov.-Dec. 2012 issue of the Harmonizer)

Every teacher was eager to learn about the new partnership between our Society and the Choral Directors of America, and extremely happy to hear that our very own Harmony Explosion! 2014 was organized and available for their participation. One teacher said, "I love your ideas and I know that many teachers will be interested in finding out how to get you in their schools!" Jerry Meier was also able to secure and donate one full-ride scholarship to Harmony University 2014, which is being held on the grounds of the very prestigious Belmont University in Nashville, TN. The SmorgasChorus from South-Central Kansas provided the Friday evening entertainment for the KCDA along with **Shaun Whisler** and *BoomTown!* They taught everyone to sing a Barbershop Tag, and Matt Weber (Director of the SmorgasChorus Chorus and Music Director at Wichita West HS) gave a very brief but informative speech about the benefits of teaching Barbershop-style Music to Middle School and High School students!

Jerry will also be meeting with several of these Music Educators this Fall at the Northeast Kansas Music Educators Association Conference in Olathe.

When Did the Handful Get SO Busy?

Well, when Jim Baqby put the group together, the 18 of us thought we would sing just occasionally for a church choir as a summer replacement. Man, were we wrong, but in a good way.

The repeats are coming around and that is encouraging. To see our crowds smiling, laughing, singing and keeping time with us is just the most rewarding and greatest feeling. This is something you just can't measure.

We have great experiences letting our audiences be a part of us. With sing-a-longs and with some comedy, we are able to share a real connection with them. We continue to do church services, retirement homes, senior groups, nursing homes, birthday parties and other performances across the metro area.

So if you can be a part of something like the New Harmony Handful then do so, because they will make you feel sort of like a rock star. Have more FUN: go sing somewhere!
