This year we conducted an experiment with the Holiday Harmony Spectacular show at Unity Village. We elected to hold just one mid-afternoon performance. The jury is still out as to forward results, but the show presentation itself was received very well.

The combined choruses of the Kansas City Chorus of Sweet Adeline's and Heart of America Chorus opened the show on Dec. 6, with O Come, O Come Emmanuel, an arrangement by our own **Dr. Bruce Wenner**. This was a somewhat different approach from past show openings; a more reverent and respectful one to the seasons' celebration – a success.

Emcees, Jennifer Roberts and Brad Dawdy, did a wonderful job of keeping the flow going in the right direction. Quartets Dynamix. Take 4 and Priorities were a wonderful addition to the program. Chorus Directors Stacy Schumacher. KCCSA, and **Jerry Garrard**, *HOA*, were exceptional in their skills to meld each of their choruses with the audience as one. Additionally, Lori Carrender and Carter Combs, Assistant Directors, contributed to the program. The headliner quartet this year was Heat, 2014 Sweet Adeline's 4th place International Quartet finalists.

Dec. 20 saw us crowding onto a bright vellow school bus with driver, Bob Eddy, who looked very much like that mythical sled driver trying to control a bunch of reindeer. Dressed in red from head to toe, red cheeks, white beard and only missing his pipe. he delivered us swiftly to six retirement villages. This was our annual Caroling Caravan, in which there were more than 40 men, perhaps the most ever, to sing on behalf of our favorite charity – the Salvation Army!

Head Elf, **Matthew Fortino**, was on hand making his way through the aisles collecting donations, and wasn't a bit bashful in methods to fill his little red kettle.

**Santa**, who not only played the part of our bus driver, was also instrumental in appearing at just the right time at each location to help promote our cause and assist Matthew collect funds that our generous audience passed our way. This was perhaps our second biggest year in the last nine, collecting just over \$21,800, the result of singing for just a few hours. That's over \$120,000 in the last 9 years!

Armchair Chorderbacks was also on hand to liven up the set and did a perfectly awful job of playing the PVC flutes, a longstanding tradition. It was a hit! And how can we not mention our ever-faithful supporters, the *Heartbeats*, who prepared delicious lunches for us to eat between gigs!

Folks, this feat could not have been possible without the tireless efforts of Co-Chairs Mike Mathieu and Bob Burdick. then throw in Director, Jerry Garrard, Assistant Director Carter Combs, soloists Jonathan Andrews and Mark Fortino and ALL-OF-YOU. This fundraising event is an annual selection by you, among your many personal priorities, which is to help those you deem to be very important. Thank you!

I've always heard, and have been able to confirm for some time now, that as you age the time either seems to speed up or you lose track of it. I prefer the former. 




# **NEW BOARD MEMBERS FOR 2015:** Dale Neuman's Installation Comments from HOA's Recent Banquet



**T**hank you, **Jerry** and *HOA*, for inviting me to do this year's installation of officers. It is an honor and privilege to be part of this rite of renewal in a chapter that has been in the business of friendship and harmony for almost 77 years. And

while I intend to take a few moments for some comments before we begin the installation, I do not want it to be said that this part of the program finished too long after it was over—a comment attributed to one composer after hearing the first performance of a major work of another composer. So I will try to be brief.

I have been a member of the Society for 43 years and a quartet singer for longer than that as my first quartet, The Four D's (Denny, Don, Dean and Dale) sang from 1952 thru 1954 while in High School. (We sang again at our 50th reunion in 2004.) And I was in another short-lived quartet while in Junior High for about a year in 1949. I went to my first chapter meeting back in Ohio in 1953 but did not join for the same reasons that many young men do not join today—time and money and plans for college. But I never lost that sense of fun and desire to ring chords that surfaced back then even as I went off to college and joined the glee club or participated in the inter-fraternity song fests that were part of the way of life at an all-male college in the 1950s. I even had experience in a short-lived quartet while in college as one summer, I got a call from a friend who had been asked to put together a four-some to do some quartet singing as part of a Fall fashion show to be held at the leading department store in Cleveland where all of the "would be" sweethearts of Sigma Chi could view their potential wardrobes for the coming college year.

But I did not get back to truly hearing and singing (and ringing) the addictive chords that made me want more until I joined HOA in 1972. From that point on, I have been involved not only in the singing of those chords as part of the chorus and several quartets but also in the back-office efforts that make it possible to do much of the singing in front of our audiences. And it is to the demands on those who do the back-office workthe officers and Board members—that I now turn. The work is not glamorous, it does not pay well, it can create issues, it takes time, it cuts into your singing time, and it means even one or more additional nights away from home each month. The opportunity costs of this hobby are higher for those who administer to its needs than for those who only sing. But I have always found them worth it as they make it possible for more men to sing and more listeners to enjoy those same sounds that got me hooked in the first place. So it is well labeled "a labor of love" for those who take on those labors.

So, now I'd like to call those officers and Board members who will serve in 2015 to come forward to commit to take on this special love affair. No, I am not going to use the marriage ceremony as a surrogate for the installation even if some think it quite apt. Rather, I am simply going to ask the officers to affirm their commitment to the Chapter and for the members to affirm their commitment to aid the officers and Board in moving the Chapter forward.




year. In return, we are able to have the Foundation designate up to 30% of the funds given to chapter activities such as Harmony Explosion.



# IN MEMORIAM

#### Jim Clark 1934 - 2014

Jim Clark, or "Coach" as he preferred, was a first-time barbershopper when he joined the Kansas City chapter in 2005. He was voiceplaced in the bass section in the Heart of America Chorus and quickly took part in chapter activities.

Jim was born in Pittsburg, Kansas, raised in

McCune, Kansas and graduated from McCune High School in 1953. After he served a four-year hitch in the U.S. Navy he received his bachelor's and master's degrees from Kansas University and spent 26 years teaching and coaching at Ruskin High School. After retirement from Ruskin, he continued to coach track and wrestling at various schools in the Kansas City area. He was very proud of his teaching and coaching accomplishments and often related how well liked he was by the students. His passion was coaching and he loved his kids. He touched many lives.

In 2009 he took over the position of Operations VP where, for three years, he directed and helped set up the risers, often by himself, and take down the risers on rehearsal nights and at performances. A hip replacement brought an end to that work but after his recovery, he still helped with the work in a limited capacity, sometimes through pain. His presence was felt in other activities as well. He and his wife **Mavis** helped with the *HOA* Garage Sale on more than one occasion. carrying, toting and bagging items when needed.

Jim was a happy man. He had a ready smile and was well liked by his chorus companions. He loved singing, both as a barbershopper and in his church choir. Two or three years ago, he began to feel faint during rehearsal for the afternoon spring show and laid down on the risers until an ambulance arrived to take him to the hospital. When it was discovered that his medication had caused the problem, he returned to sit in the audience at the evening performance.

Two weeks prior to his death, Jim went to the hospital complaining of shortness of breath, but was allowed to go home. On Aug. 28, he began to experience kidney failure and was admitted to the hospital and put on dialysis. He died Aug. 29, 2014. Jim's memory is vivid and his presence is still felt by many in the chapter and chorus. He is greatly missed.

42 Heart of America barbershoppers sang Jim's favorite song, Lullaby and Friends, under the direction of Jerry Garrard.



#### C.V. Rice 1927 - 2014

Not many in the HOA chorus knew C.V.'s first name was Chauncey, we always called him C.V. His relatives and close family friends new his name, of course, and some had other nicknames for him. It was said that his wife, Joyce, called him Chuck. Most in the chorus who knew him remember him as a soft spoken man who

enjoyed reliving old memories when he visited the chapter.

C. V. joined the U.S. Navy during WWII and served from 1945 to 1946. Following the service, he received a BS degree in Business Administration and Accounting from the University of Wichita in 1950. He was active in the United Methodist church in Wichita and was a long-time member of the Old Mission United Methodist Church in Fairway, Kansas.

He always had a love for music. He played the trumpet in high school and in the Boeing Band when he lived in Wichita, and he sang in church choirs much of his life. He joined the barbershop society, then known as SPEBSQSA, sometime before 1981 (our earliest confirmed record), and sang with the Wichita, Kansas and Lincoln, Nebraska chapters before joining HOA. Bruce Wenner remembers him as "a pretty darn good Treasurer" in 1976. C. V. was active in the Kansas City chapter until 1986 but had to drop out because of voice problems. He returned in 1990 but left again in 1996.

When his family asked if a quartet would sing at his funeral, they were overjoyed when a very large quartet showed up. 14 members of HOA gathered at the Old Mission United Methodist Church to sing / Believe under the direction of Jim Bagby.




#### Lyle Rolofson 1943 - 2014

**Lyle Rolofson**, a long-time barbershopper and occasional visitor to HOA, died December 19, 2014. He sang with the Vocal Majority in Dallas, Texas and was a member of the *Ambassadors of* Harmony in St. Charles, Missouri for a period of time after leaving the V.M. He never transferred

his membership from Dallas to the Kansas City chapter.

John was active member of Kansas City Chapter and sang lead in the *HOA* chorus until 1986. Many who knew John, remember him as an active chorus member and show ticket salesman, and served as chapter President in 1971 and was Barbershopper of the Year in 1976. He and his second wife, **Margaret**, moved to Florida in 1992 as the first residents of Freedom Plaza in Sun City Center. After moving to Florida, the chapter lost contact with him and though his name would surface in conversations from time to time, not much was known until a member of his family sent word that he had died.

His obituary in the Tampa Bay Times details how John enlisted the Army Air Corp during WWll and flew P-38's in 50 combat missions, earning both the Distinguished Flying Cross and the Air Medal with 11 oak leaf clusters. He later was a P-38 instructor before serving in Korea. He was active in a number of service organizations during his lifetime, including Rotary International, VFW, MOAA and MOWW, on his church Vestry and sang in the church choir.

Memorial services were held in Sun City Center, Dec. 27, 2014.



Joe Costigan

**Herman Joseph "Joe" Costigan**, 77, died Oct. 31, 2014 in Kansas City. Joe was a long time member of the Kansas City Chapter and sang bass in the *HOA* chorus. He served as President in 1970 and was Barbershopper of the year in 1972. He left the chapter in 1986. He would occasionally visit the chorus during

Salvation Army performances to talk with old friends and sing a tag or two during breaks in singing. He considered returning to the chapter several years ago but his plan never materialized.
